RECLAMATION AGREEMENT

WHEREAS, the State of Alaska may require IPOP LLC to provide an individual financial assurance to cover estimated costs of reclamation associated with U.S. Army Corps of Engineers Permit No. 2018-00123 and APMA No. F20242785; and

WHEREAS L7 Consulting LLC, a Texas limited liability company is a contractor for the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers and others (including IPOP LLC) on dredging projects; and

WHEREAS, L7 Consulting has provided information for the attached reclamation cost estimate (RCE) based on review of the reclamation plan and other information, which estimate has been accepted by the Alaska Department of Natural Resources (ADNR) as the basis for an individual assurance requirement posted by IPOP LLC; and

WHEREAS that estimate assumes that the suction dredging barge owned by IPOP LLC and certain other equipment onsite will be used in any reclamation of the IPOP LLC mining site;

IT IS HEREBY AGREED THAT:

1. IPOP LLC hereby leases the suction dredging barge, crane, and two push boats to L7 Consulting LLC at a rate of \$1 per year, said lease to commence upon a determination by ADNR that IPOP has violated its reclamation plan resulting in forfeiture of the individual financial assurance ("Forfeiture Declaration), and ending upon either (a) the completion of the reclamation to the reasonable satisfaction of ADNR or (b) upon a determination by ADNR to engage any entity other than L7 Consulting Inc. to complete reclamation after a Forfeiture Declaration.

2. IPOP LLC may not remove the equipment from the vicinity of Nome, Alaska until termination of the lease. L7 Consulting LLC agrees to accept the suction dredging barge and other equipment "as is, where is" for use in executing the reclamation plan and shall be entitled and required to make such repairs and modifications as are necessary to execute the plan.

3. IPOP LLC further agrees that upon any Forfeiture Declaration, title to the suction dredging barge and other equipment is hereby pledged to L7 Consulting LLC as security for any reclamation costs incurred by L7 Consulting LLC not covered by releases from the individual financial assurance. IPOP retains the right to cover any deficiency.

4. Provided that ADNR requires IPOP LLC to post an individual financial assurance in at least the amount of the estimate, and an amount of the individual financial assurance in at least the amount of the estimate is dedicated to payment of L7 Contracting LLC, ADNR may engage, but is not required to engage, L7 Consulting LLC as the contractor to complete reclamation of the IPOP LLC mining site in the event of a Forfeiture Declaration at the full cost provided in the estimate under standard state contracting terms.


