The following changes are required:

1. The following is a clarification to amendment #2, the last paragraph.

The department will review State approved equivalents either in accordance with amendment #2 (prior to the ITB due date) or after the ITB due date and time. It is not required for State approved equivalents to be listed in ITB section 2.10 Scope of Work and Specifications.

The following are vendor questions and the department's response:

1. Vendor: There was a question from the manufacturer about the insulated lines and compartment. The compartment that houses the pump is insulated, but mainly for noise. There is nothing in the compartment at risk of freezing however. This is not a product pump where liquids flow through it. The purpose of the pump is to create vacuum and pressure. Also, what specific lines would you want insulated. I assume you're referring to the coolant lines that heat the jacket valves. Am I correct in this assumption?

Department: ITB section 2.10, Scope of Work and Specifications, #2, f. shall read: The coolant lines shall be insulated, and the mechanical compartment shall be insulated if not already standard to the equipment.

2. Vendor: The attached detailed specification now shows every item in ITB section 2.10, #2 included. Page 11 details the information on the tank. It now shows the 20' hose, heated compartment and insulated valve jacket hoses.

Department: The 2024 International HV607 SBA is added to ITB section 2.10. All items in ITB section 2.10 Scope of Work and Specifications, #2 must be included for all brand and models.
