The Department of Corrections is issuing this addendum to the Invitation to Bid (ITB) for the above project.

- 1. Delete the Original ITB, Contract Form, page 29 and replace with: See attached Contract Form (2 pages).
- 2. Delete the Original ITB, Bid Schedule, page 20 and replace with: See attached Bid Schedule (2 pages).
- 3. Add Liquidated Damages to the contract to reads as follows:

LIQUIDATED DAMAGES:

- Five Thousand Dollars (\$5,000.00) per day for each calendar day elapsing between the time stipulated for the <u>sub-completion date</u> and in accordance with the terms hereof; such deduction to be made, or sum to be recovered, not as a penalty but as liquidated damages.
- One Hundred Fifteen Dollars & Zero Cents (\$115.00) per day for each calendar day elapsing between the time stipulated for the <u>final completion date</u> and in accordance with the terms hereof; such dedication to be made, or sum to be recovered, not as a penalty but as liquidated damages.
- 4. On page 115, Under Scope of Work, of the Original ITB, change Base Bid to read as follows:

SCOPE OF WORK:

The Alaska Department of Corrections, Lemon Creek Correctional Center, is requiring a contractor to provide all labor, materials, equipment and travel / lodging cost to remove existing boilers units and installing three (3) new Weil-McClain 1594 boilers as specified or state approved equivalent. The intent is to install the new boilers in the current locations of the existing boilers.

Major Deliverables:

• The project will deliver three (3) new boilers and install.

Base Bid:

- Remove 2 old boilers from facility.
- Provide and install 3 new Weil-McClain 1594 boilers as specified or state approved equivalent.

- Demo and install new oil lines as needed
- All appurtenances required to complete installation shall be provided by contractor.
- Test and run new boilers for functional inspection and provide 4-hours of on-site training for operation, trouble shooting, preventive maintenance and replacement parts repair and sourcing.
- Boiler replacement work to be performed in existing remote maintenance building. Contractor must maintain minimum 68-degree temperature in Main Administration/Housing building. Coordination of demolition and installation of new lines are contractors' responsibility. No loss of heat below 68 degrees in main building acceptable. No loss of domestic hot water for more than 72 hours acceptable. Contractor must coordinate any domestic hot water outage 48 hours in advance.
- Contractor must provide a cutover plan approved by DOC to ensure 72-hour hot water compliance.
- Provide 1 year warranty for parts and labor. Provide equipment manufacturers O&M warranty. Provide redlined drawings prior to final completion for approval.

Additive Alternate 1:

• Remove & Replace existing Day Tank.

Project Plan and work scope:

- Provide work sequence plan.
- Provide project schedule.
- Provide schedule of values.

Compliance and Safety:

- Adhere to all relevant OSHA safety regulations and standards.
- Ensure minimal disruption to the facility's operations during the project.
- Contractor onsite supervisor shall be OSHA 30 hour certified. Must be present all times work is being performed.

Contractor Responsibilities:

- Contractor shall install new boilers and all appurtenances.
- Contractor is responsible for all patching, painting, and cleaning.
- Contractor to demo oil lines as necessary.
- Contractor is responsible for all water flow balancing associated with the boiler replacement to ensuring that the water flow rates are properly adjusted throughout the system to achieve optimal performance and efficiency of the new boiler.
- Contractor shall provide start-up, commissioning, adjusting, testing and operator training by manufacturers representative.
- Contractor shall provide O&M manuals, as-built drawings, and warranties.
- Contractor to work closely with manufacturer representative for final approval and acceptance of new work.
- All work to be done in accordance with engineer's design and specifications.

The following are questions from interested parties and the department 's response.

 On M-01 Under Additive Alternate 2 it reference complete asbestos abatement in the Boiler Room per existing 1995 Asbestos Report. I do not see the report in the documents. Is it available?

A: Additive Alternate 2 is deleted to the scope of work. DOC will be responsible for abatement of the asbestos.

It is distinctly understood and agreed that no claim for additional work or materials, done or furnished by the Contractor and not specifically herein provided for, will be allowed by the Department, nor shall the Contractor do any work or furnish any material not covered by this Contract, unless such work is ordered in writing by the Department. In no event shall the Department be liable for any materials furnished or used, or for any work or labor done, unless the materials, work, or labor are required by the Contract or on written order furnished by the Department. Any such work or materials which may be done or furnished by the Contractor without written order first being given shall be at the Contractor's own risk, cost, and expense and the Contractor hereby covenants and agrees to make no claim for compensation for work or materials done or furnished without such written order.

The Contractor further covenants and agrees that all materials shall be furnished and delivered, and all labor shall be done and performed, in every respect, to the satisfaction of the Department, on or before: August 1, 2025 for Substantial Completion Date and September 30, 2025 for the Final Completion Date. It is expressly understood and agreed that in case of the failure on the part of the Contractor, for any reason, except with the written consent of the Department, to complete the furnishing and delivery of materials and the doing and performance of the work before the aforesaid date, the Department shall have the right to deduct from any money due or which may become due the Contractor, or if no money shall be due, the Department shall have the right to recover the following amounts:
