Dear Lieutenant Governor Dahlstrom:

The Department of Law has reviewed the attached regulations of the Alaska Police Standards Council against the statutory standards of the Administrative Procedure Act. Based upon our review, we find no legal problems. This letter constitutes the written statement of approval under AS 44.62.060(b) and (c) that authorizes your office to file the attached regulations. The regulations were adopted by the Alaska Police Standards Council after the close of the public comment period.

The regulations concern police officer certifications. The regulations provide for new certification types for police officers and for correction, probation, and parole officers, and establish the eligibility criteria for obtaining these certifications.

The January 26, 2024 public notice and the December 13, 2024 certification of adoption both state that this action is not expected to require an increased appropriation. Therefore, a fiscal note under AS 44.62.060 is not required.

We have made some technical corrections to conform the regulations in accordance with AS 44.62.060. The corrections are incorporated into the attached copy of the regulations.

ORDER CERTIFYING THE CHANGES TO **REGULATIONS OF** ALASKA POLICE STANDARDS COUNCIL

The attached nine (9) pages of regulations, dealing with certification levels and standards for police, probation, parole, correctional, and municipal correctional officers, are certified to be a correct copy of the regulation changes that the Alaska Police Standards Council adopted at its December 2, 2024 meeting, under the authority of AS 18.65.220(1) and after compliance with the Administrative Procedure Act (AS 44.62), specifically including notice under AS 44.62.190 and 44.62.200 and opportunity for public comment under AS 44.62.210.

This action is not expected to require an increased appropriation.

On the record, in considering public comments, the Alaska Police Standards Council paid special attention to the cost to private persons of the regulatory action being taken.

The regulation changes described in this order take effect on the 30th day after they have been filed by the lieutenant governor, as provided in AS 44.62.180.
