**New Business:** Board of Game <u>Statewide Regulations</u>

The Fairbanks AC Game/Trap subcommittee spent 3 hours and 45 minutes going over all of the Statewide proposals.

Bennett Wong gave a talk about his proposal #145 to allow Eurasian Eagle Owls to the clean list and explained the importance of being compensated in order to continue to give educational presentations on raptors. The food for Eurasian Eagle Owls and falcons adds up in cost and falconers cannot be compensated for educational efforts, but allowing Eurasian Eagle Owls within Alaska is one way he and others can continue to give educational presentations on raptors and defray some of that cost in doing so. We don't anticipate anyone trying to make money off of this, only to help defray costs.

One question the subcommittee had was if the Alaska Falconers Association supported his proposal, but this proposal isn't about falcons per se, and the Falconers Association has not weighed in yet. After Mr. Wong's talk, the subcommittee was unanimous in support of his proposal.

The subcommittee recommendations will be presented to the full AC for approval at our February 12, 2025, meeting. The subcommittee brings our recommendations to the full AC for approval, and anyone on the AC can question or vote against any of our recommendations at the full AC meeting. There are 5 proposals that the subcommittee decided to bring before the full AC.

Our AC believes that having subcommittees go over the proposals to the Boards of Fisheries and Game saves time at full AC meetings and streamlines the process. We encourage any AC members with interest in game or fish issues and proposals to attend the subcommittee meetings.
