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**Questions and answers**

**Question #1:**

Is the bidder responsible for the actual unloading and equipment required to do so?

**Answer #1:**

**Question #2:**

There will be a loader with forks to unload us correct?

**Answer #2:**

No, the bidder is responsible for the actual unloading and equipment required to do so.

**Question #3:**

Is the 3-1/2" dunnage that will be banded to the bottom of the units sufficient for required storage?

**Answer #3:**

Yes, the 3-1/2" dunnage is sufficient for the required storage.

**Question #4:**

Can we put 3" dunnage under the units instead of 3-1/2" ?

**Answer #4:**

Yes, 3" dunnage is okay. Minimum should be 3" and a maximum of 4" dunnage. That sufficiently keeps all the wood off the ground.
