My plan would be to dig a "un-housed" pit privy, or a privy that only has a lid covering. The lid will serve as protection from rain and snow preventing the pit from filling with extra fluids. It will also prevent insects, vermin, and other animals from entering the pit. It will be dug atleast 4' above groundwater table to be established down river and 150' or more away from water shed and its source, to include but not limited too; surface water, wetlands, sloughs, swamps, and drinking water. The pit will be filled in with the lid and any other items associated with the privy transported back to our main lodge via aircraft at seasons end. Privy location is to be determind this fall at the beginning of the site set up.


