Changes to the RFP:

Change 1: Deadline for submission of proposals has been extended to April 14, 2025, at 4:30 p.m. AKST.

Change 2: Provide updated cost proposal. Attachment 1 – Cost Proposal – A2 Update must be used in response to this solicitation in order to be considered responsive.

Change 3: In Section 1.04 Prior Experience, remove “Have a minimum of 10 years of experience in the disposal of biohazard medical waste.” and replace with: “Receive a minimum score of 85% or higher on the last two state inspections. Contractors must evidence of the last two state inspection scores with their proposal in order to be considered responsive. If requested by the procurement officer, additional documentation must be provided within five days of the request.”

Questions submitted by potential offerors and answers from the state:

Question 1: Section 2.04 Deliverables, A Crime Lab representative must sign and date receipts indicating the amount of waste picked up and a copy is to be left with that person at the facility. Would an electronic copy emailed suffice.

Answer: Yes, an electronic copy emailed would be accepted.

Question 2: Are cardboard boxes required or will poly containers with lids both meet the standards defined in the RFP?

Answer: Either cardboard boxes or poly containers with lids are acceptable.

Question 3: Do you require cardboard boxes in the same size or one of a different size if it meets the volume needs?

Answer: Any size cardboard box would be accepted as long as it meets the volume needs.
