Dear Lieutenant Governor Dahlstrom:

The Department of Law has reviewed the attached regulations of the Department of Environmental Conservation against the statutory standards of the Administrative Procedure Act. Based upon our review, we find no legal problems. This letter constitutes the written statement of approval under AS 44.62.060(b) and (c) that authorizes your office to file the attached regulations. The regulations were adopted by the Department of Environmental Conservation after the close of the public comment period.

The regulations concern repeal of Alaska Food Code exemptions found at 18 AAC 31.012(a) to ensure consistency with the homemade food exemptions enacted in 2024 through passage of House Bill 251 (Chapter 34, SLA 24). House Bill 251 allows production, sale, and personal consumption of homemade food prepared in home kitchens to be exempt from certain state labeling, licensing, packaging, and inspection requirements.

The January 8, 2025 public notice and the April 8, 2025 adoption order both state that this action is not expected to require an increased appropriation. Therefore, a fiscal note under AS 44.62.195 is not required.

We have made some technical corrections to conform the regulations in accordance with AS 44.62.060 that reduced the adopted regulations from two pages to one. The corrections are incorporated into the attached copy of the regulations.

OF THE DEPARTMENT OF ENVIRONMENTAL CONSERVATION

The attached two pages of regulations, dealing with the repeal of 18 AAC 31.012(a), are adopted and certified to be a correct copy of the regulation changes that the Department of Environmental Conservation adopts under the authority of AS 17.20.005; AS 17.20.010; AS 17.20.020; AS 17.20.180; AS 17.20.290; and AS 44.46.020 and after compliance with the Administrative Procedure Act (AS 44.62), specifically including notice under AS 44.62.190 and 44.62.200 and opportunity for public comment under AS 44.62.210.

This action is not expected to require an increased appropriation.

In considering public comments, the Department of Environmental Conservation paid special attention to the cost to private persons of the regulatory action being taken.

The regulation changes adopted under this order take effect on the 30th day after they have been filed by the lieutenant governor as provided in AS 44.62.180.
