- 8. The primary contractor working on public construction projects with an amount of \$25,000 or more must file a Notice of Work and pay a one percent fee based on the estimated value of work performed by the prime contractor and one percent of the value of each subcontractor's price, to the Department of Labor and Workforce Development, Wage and Hour Administration (DOLWD) The maximum fee is \$5,000.00. The notice and fees must be filed with the DOLWD before work commences on the project.

Upon completing the construction project, the primary contractor must file a Notice of Completion (NOC) and make payment of any additional fees due to increases in the contract amounts due the primary contractor. - 9. The Contractor shall indemnify, save harmless, and defend the Procurement Agency, its agents and its employees in accordance with Appendix B1 below. Furthermore, the Contractor shall, prior to the Award of the contract, provide proof of Workmen's Compensation, General Liability, and Automobile Insurance in amounts as applicable under Appendix B1. These coverages shall remain in force for the duration of the Contract.
- 10. The Contractor shall remedy all defects in materials or workmanship that develop within a period of one year from the date of final payment.

APPENDIX
