## **Scope of Work**

## **Project Description:**

Remove and replace the courtyard concrete patio area at the Ketchikan Pioneer Home.

## **Project constraints and limitations:**

The contractor shall coordinate and assist the Ketchikan Pioneer Home (KPH) Maintenance Foreman to maximize pedestrian traffic flow and minimize disruption. The contractor must erect sufficient barriers and signage to minimize risk to elderly residents, staff, preschoolers, public traffic, and keep all foot traffic from entering the construction area throughout the project. Priority shall be given to concrete work in and adjacent to Pre-School, resident dining and resident rooms to minimize disruption. Days and hours for all work are to be completed Monday – Saturday from 7am to 5PM. The contractor must not disturb the circle landscaping bricks and connect the new concrete to the concrete next to the bricks.

- Contractors shall not destroy landscaping. Any damaged landscaping is to be repaired at the contractor's expense.
- Contractors will be responsible for keeping the work zone safe and redirecting all traffic by providing detours or alternate access as required by the facility.
- Contractors will need to coordinate parking with City and other entities.
- The contractor will have a Silica Plan as required.
- Pre-school traffic will need to be redirected by contractors.

## Scope of work for 4-inch-thick sidewalks:

- Use ready-mix fiber reinforced concrete for all sidewalks with a minimum compressive strength of 4,000 psi mix at 28 days designed for maximum strength, durability, and longevity.
- Slope all concrete away from structures and to the existing drains at ¼ inch per foot (2%)

All concrete will be formed with 2" x 4" lumber. It is highly recommended to attend the pre-bid site visit on August 21, 2025 at 1:00PM to assess the job. There is approximately 2,000 square feet of concrete to remove and replace.

## **Site Preparation**

- Remove existing concrete.
- Excavate the area to the required depth to accommodate the concrete slab and base material.

- Remove all debris, vegetation, and loose material from the subgrade.
- Compact the subgrade soil to a firm and stable condition using mechanical compaction equipment.
- Install a 3-4-inch-thick layer of crushed gravel or stone base, compacted to at least 95% Proctor density, to provide a stable, well-drained foundation.
- Use #3 or #4 rebar dowels in all areas where new concrete will join up with existing concrete.
- The end of the circle that buts up to the grass area will be squared off and go all the way to the building. Verify this area with the maintenance foreman during the site visit.
- The contractor must protect the building, windows, doors in the entire construction area with plastic or tarps.
- The contractor must coordinate with the maintenance personnel to make sure the blue doors that
  exit out of the building to the construction area are locked and are not able to open during the
  project.

## **Concrete Placement:**

- Place concrete on the prepared base, ensuring even distribution and consistent thickness of **4 inches**.
- Use proper tools and techniques to consolidate the concrete, eliminating voids and honeycombing.

## **Control Joints:**

- Tool cut joints at intervals not that will best prevent cracking, cutting to a minimum depth of 1 inch (¼ of slab thickness).
- Provide asphalt fiber board expansion joints of ½ inch thickness at intersections with other structures.

## Finishing:

- Float and finish the surface to a smooth, level condition.
- Apply a broom finish adequate for slip resistance in opposite direction of foot traffic.
- Tool edges to minimize cracking and improve aesthetics.

## **Cleanup and Protection:**

- Remove all formwork and debris from the site.
- Protect the newly poured concrete from traffic, weather, and other disturbances until it reaches adequate strength.
- Provide signage or barriers to prevent foot traffic on the slab during curing.

- Parties to the Contract includes the Procurement Agency, the owner Agency representing the State of Alaska, and the Contractor, being the entity contracting with the owner Agency for performance of the Work.
- · Project The total construction, of which the Work performed under the Contract, is the whole or part.

If Required and Noted on Page one of the Notice of Award Form SPC-003, the CONTRACTOR shall furnish Performance and Payment Bonds, each in an amount as shown on the Contract as security for the faithful performance and payment of all CONTRACTOR'S obligations under the Contract Documents. These bonds shall remain in effect for one year after the date of Final Acceptance and until all obligations under this Contract, except special guarantees as per 12.7, have been met. All bonds shall be furnished on forms provided by the DEPARTMENT (or copies thereof) and shall be executed by such Sureties as are authorized to do business in the State of Alaska. The Contracting Officer may at his option copy the Surety with notice of any potential default or liability.

At the option of the CONTRACTOR, bonds may be provided by individual Surety the adequacy of which shall be determined by the Contracting Officer. Any costs incurred by the CONTRACTOR or individual Surety shall be borne by the CONTRACTOR. Where individual Sureties are used, two individual Sureties must each provide the State of Alaska with security equal to the amount of each bond by one, or a combination of, the following methods:

- a. Escrow account in the name of the DEPARTMENT for the duration of the Contract. Acceptable securities would include, but not necessarily be limited to: Cash; treasury notes; bearer instruments having a specific value, or; money market certificates.
- b. If buildings or other valued improvements are involved then fire and casualty insurance with the State of Alaska as a named insured and in limits and coverages acceptable to the Contracting Officer shall be required. The appraiser shall acknowledge in writing that the appraisal is prepared for the benefit of the DEPARTMENT and the DEPARTMENT has the right to rely on its contents. This *Deed* must be recorded in the recording office where the property is located.

### Replacement of Bond and Surety:

If the Surety on any bond furnished in connection with this Contract is declared bankrupt or becomes insolvent or its right to do business is terminated in any state where any part of the Project is located or it ceases to meet the requirements of paragraph 5.2, or otherwise becomes unacceptable to the DEPARTMENT, or if any such Surety fails to furnish reports as to his financial condition as requested by the DEPARTMENT, the CONTRACTOR shall within five days thereafter substitute another bond and Surety, both of which must be acceptable to DEPARTMENT.

An individual Surety may be replaced by a corporate Surety during the course of the Contract period. If the Surety desires to dispose of the collateral posted, the DEPARTMENT may, at its option, accept substitute collateral.

The Contractor shall indemnify, hold harmless, and defend the contracting agency from and against any claim of, or liability for error, omission or negligent act of the Contractor under this agreement. The Contractor shall not be required to indemnify the contracting agency for a claim of, or liability for, the independent negligence of the contracting agency.
