Dear Paydirt Excavation:

Pursuant to AS 16.05.871 (b), the Alaska Department of Fish and Game (ADF&G) Habitat Section has reviewed your proposal to remove gravel from a sandbar on the Kuskokwim River. Gravel removal was previously authorized under FH20-III-0014. We received your Fish Habitat Permit application on January 21, 2025.

Project Description

Paydirt Excavation proposes to remove 4,000 cubic yards of gravel and sand from a sandbar on the Kuskokwim River. The sandbar is located due north of the McGrath airport runway. Gravel will be extracted using an excavator performing shallow scrapes no deeper than 3-feet, and material will be taken away to an upland stockpile location using a dump truck. The anticipated timing window for this work is October 1, 2025 to December 31, 2025.

Anadromous Fish Act

The Kuskokwim River (Stream Number 335-30-16600) has been specified as being important for the spawning, rearing, or migration of anadromous fishes pursuant to AS 16.05.871(a). The water body provides migration habitat for Chinook, coho, chum, and sockeye salmon, sheefish, and humpback whitefish. Your project as proposed should not have adverse effects on anadromous fish or their habitat and should not obstruct the free passage of fish.

In accordance with AS 16.05.871(d), your project is approved subject to the project description and permit terms, with the following stipulations:

1. Gravel excavation & removal is authorized only when river levels are low and the gravel bar is above water (i.e. not submerged).
2. Gravel extraction operations shall be conducted in a manner that does not create depressions or cuts that will trap fish when water levels fluctuate. If a depression is created during material removal, an outlet channel as deep as the lowest elevation point of the depression shall be constructed, contoured, and maintained to drain to the active channel of the river to ensure fish are not trapped with fluctuating water levels.
3. All refueling of equipment shall occur above the ordinary high-water line of the Kuskokwim River.

Permit Terms

This letter constitutes a permit issued under the authority of AS 16.05.871 and must be retained on site during project activities. Please be advised that this determination applies only to activities regulated by the Habitat Section of ADF&G; other agencies also may have jurisdiction under their respective authorities. This determination does not relieve you of your responsibility to secure other permits; state, federal, or local. You are still required to comply with all other applicable laws.

You are responsible for the actions of contractors, agents, or other persons who perform work to accomplish the approved project. For any activity that significantly deviates from the approved plan, you shall notify the ADF&G Habitat Section and obtain written approval in the form of a permit amendment before beginning the activity. Any action that increases the project's overall scope or that negates, alters, or minimizes the intent or effectiveness of any provision contained in this permit will be deemed a significant deviation from the approved plan. The final determination as to the significance of any deviation and the need for a permit amendment is the responsibility of the ADF&G Habitat Section. Therefore, it is recommended that you consult the Habitat Section before considering any deviation from the approved plan.

You shall give an authorized representative of the state free and unobstructed access to the permit site, at safe and reasonable times, for the purpose of inspecting or monitoring compliance with any provision of this permit. You shall furnish whatever assistance and information the authorized representative reasonably requires for monitoring and inspection purposes.

In addition to the penalties provided by law, this permit may be terminated or revoked for failure to comply with its provisions or failure to comply with applicable statutes and regulations. You shall mitigate any adverse effect upon fish or wildlife, their habitats, or any restriction or interference with public use that the commissioner determines was a direct result of your failure to comply with this permit or any applicable law.

You shall indemnify, save harmless, and defend the department, its agents, and its employees from any and all claims, actions, or liabilities for injuries or damages sustained by any person or property arising directly or indirectly from permitted activities or your performance under this permit. However, this provision has no effect if, and only if, the sole proximate cause of the injury is the department's negligence.

You may appeal this permit decision relating to AS 16.05.871 in accordance with the provisions of AS 44.62.330-630.




