

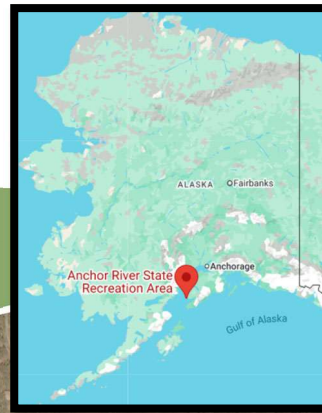
Anchor River SRA lies about 14 miles north of Homer on the west side of the Kenai Peninsula

Stats and Facts

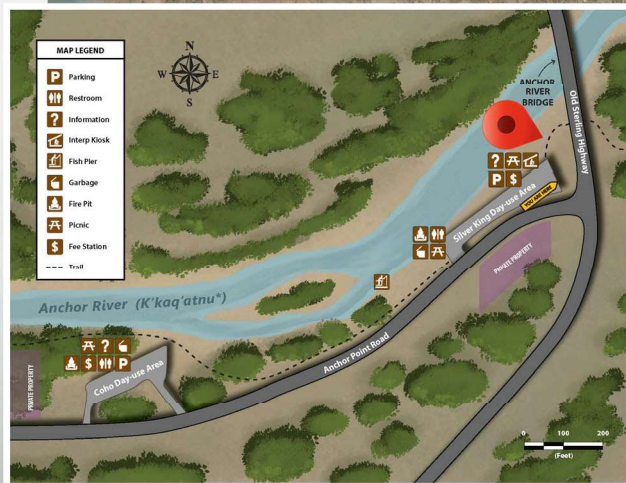
Silver King Day-use Area is the first port of call within the extensive Anchor River State Recreation Area. Here, anglers gain easy access to world-class fishing spots along Anchor River.

Access: Mile 0.1 of Anchor Point Rd.

Amenities: The day-use area includes river access, restrooms, interpretive panels, picnic tables with designated fire pits, and an elevated fishing pier. The trail under the bridge leads to the ADF&G fishing weir, while the trail west leads to the Coho Day-use Area and eventually the Steelhead and Slidehole Campgrounds.

Drinking water is located within Slidehole Campground.

TREAD LIGHTLY: Healthy banks with lots of leaves, stems, and roots provide critical habitat for juvenile and adult fish. Help protect Anchor River fish habitat by remaining on designated trails, stairs, and walkways. Instead, fish and walk along the sturdy gravel bed of the river.
