Questions submitted by potential offerors and answers from the state:

Question 1: Is the bid bond required to be for the total bid amount or is there a percentage that the bond should be made out for?

Answer: In accordance with [3 AAC 100.130\(a\)](#) and [2 AAC 12.810](#), the bid bond is not required to be for the total bid amount. Instead, a bid bond (or other acceptable bid security) must be submitted in an amount equal to five percent (5%) of the total bid price. This requirement applies to construction projects estimated to exceed \$100,000.

Question 2: The scope of work states that a list of subcontractors must be provided along with the offerors quote. The offeror's checklist does not list this as an item to be included and I don't see that a subcontractor list form has been provided. Can you please verify if this is something that should be provided with our proposal?

Answer: Please use the subcontractor form located on page 3 of this Addendum.

Question 3: Is the offeror's questionnaire required to be provided with our proposal or is this form something that is only required for the low bidder?

Answer: The Offeror's Questionnaire, SPC Form-008 must be submitted with your bid in order for it to be considered responsive.

During contract negotiation, the state may require a signed written statement from each subcontractor that clearly verifies the subcontractor is committed to performing the services required by the contract. Prior to contract award, the state will also require evidence that a subcontractor possesses a valid Alaska business license if they will be performing work within Alaska.

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
