

The State of Alaska desires that all Offerors submitting quotes on construction contracts are given a fair and equal opportunity to compete. Offerors are required to follow these instructions:

REVIEW THE PROJECT DOCUMENTS: Most construction Projects in excess of \$1,000 will have some type of written documentation prepared expressly for the Work. If you are asked to submit a quote and no written information has been provided, you should ask the procurement Agency for written documentation. If the scope of services have been described to you verbally, and you are selected for Contract Award, you must ensure that the information of the services to be performed (scope of work) is put in writing prior to accepting the Contract. When providing a Quote, carefully review and consider all materials related to the solicitation and work of the contract. By submitting a quote the Offeror warrants that they are familiar with the Project requirements, have visited or otherwise examined the site, and are aware of the conditions to be encountered. Offeror's can verify the contents and completeness of their quote documents by contacting the procurement Agency individual named on the front of this form.

SUBMITTING THE QUOTE: The Quote must be submitted in one of the following formats as called for in the Invitation:

NOTE: The Department of Labor requires an Offeror to be licensed and registered for the required type of work prior to submitting a quote. If the procurement Agency determines the Offeror is improperly registered or licensed, their quote may be deemed nonresponsive.

<u>SUBCONTRACTOR LISTING:</u> Subcontractors intended to be utilized on this contract must be listed in the response to the solicitation. Work shall not be awarded to any subcontractor without prior approval from the procurement Agency. Subcontractors may be added or removed only as approved by the procurement Agency.

DETERMINATION OF THE LOWEST RESPONSIBLE QUOTE AND CONTRACT AWARD: Following receipt and determination of all **responsive** oral, written or sealed quotes, the procurement Agency will compare the quotes and determine the lowest Offeror. If the procurement Agency discovers a discrepancy between the unit price amount and the extended amount; the unit price amount will prevail. Conditioned quotes, unless expressly requested, will not be considered. When the quote schedule is composed of a basic amount with alternates, the procurement Agency will base its determination of the low quote and the amount of the Contract Award solely upon those quotes, basic and alternates, that are priced within the extent of available construction funds. Alternates will be considered for Award in the order listed, except that if the order of Offerors is not affected, the Award may include any combination of funded alternates, or none, as may be in the best interest of the procurement Agency.

When determining the lowest quote, the procurement Agency will also give a 5% Alaska Offeror's preference and an appropriate Alaska Products preference to quotes designating the applicability of a preference. To qualify for the Offeror's preference (per AS 36.30.170) the Offeror must (1) hold a current Alaska Business License, (2) submit the quote under the name appearing on the license, (3) have staffed and maintained a place of business within Alaska for the previous six months and (4) be incorporated or qualified to do business under the laws of the State. In addition, if the Offeror is a partnership or joint venture, all parties must meet the criteria to be eligible for the preference. If the lowest Offeror is found to be nonresponsible, this process will be repeated with the second lowest Offeror -- and so on until the lowest responsive and responsible Offeror is determined.

NOTICE OF AWARD AND PROTEST: A written notice will be provided on all Awards exceeding \$ 25,000 (2 AAC 12.400(h)). All protests must be filed with the Commissioner of the procurement Agency (or designee) and copied to the Procurement Officer. Protest procedures are described in AS 36.30.560 and 2 AAC 12.695. The extent of the protest remedy is limited to quote preparation costs (AS 36.30.585).

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3. INDEMNITY AND INSURANCE – The following insurance is required for all construction contracts: Article 1. Indemnification

The Contractor shall indemnify, hold harmless, and defend the contracting agency from and against any claim of, or liability for error, omission or negligent act of the Contractor under this agreement. The Contractor shall not be required to indemnify the contracting agency for a claim of, or liability for, the independent negligence of the contracting agency. If there is a claim of, or liability for, the joint negligent error or omission of the Contractor and the independent negligence of the Contracting agency, the indemnification and hold harmless obligation shall be apportioned on a comparative fault basis. "Contractor" and "Contracting agency", as used within this and the following article, include the employees, agents and other contractors who are directly responsible, respectively, to each. The term "independent negligence" is negligence other than in the Contracting agency's selection, administration, monitoring, or controlling of the Contractor and in approving or accepting the Contractor's work.

Article 2. Insurance

Without limiting contractor's indemnification, it is agreed that contractor shall purchase at its own expense and maintain in force at all times during the performance of services under this agreement the following policies of insurance. Where specific limits are shown, it is understood that they shall be the minimum acceptable limits. If the contractor's policy contains higher limits, the state shall be entitled to coverage to the extent of such higher limits. Certificates of Insurance must be furnished to the contracting officer prior to beginning work and must provide for a notice of cancellation, non-renewal, or material change of conditions in accordance with policy provisions. Failure to furnish satisfactory evidence of insurance or lapse of the policy is a material breach of this contract and shall be grounds for termination of the contractor's services. All insurance policies shall comply with and be issued by insurers licensed to transact the business of insurance under AS 21.

- **2.1 Workers' Compensation Insurance:** The Contractor shall provide and maintain, for all employees engaged in work under this contract, coverage as required by AS 23.30.045, and; where applicable, any other statutory obligations including but not limited to Federal U.S.L. & H. and Jones Act requirements. The policy must waive subrogation against the State.
- 2.2 Commercial General Liability Insurance: The State of Alaska, Department of Transportation and Public Facilities shall provide a policy that will protect the state against tort claims for negligent acts of the Contractor. This policy will only cover duties and services performed under this contract. The policy is only provided to those Contractors who are unable to secure a policy in the commercial market. For those Contractors who can obtain a policy in the performance of services under this agreement, please provide with minimum coverage limits of \$300,000 combined single limit per claim.
- **2.3** Commercial Automobile Liability Insurance: covering all vehicles used by the Contractor in the performance of services under this agreement with minimum coverage limits of \$300,000 combined single limit per claim.

TECHNICAL SPECIFICATIONS

PILE BAY ROAD MAINTENANCE IFQ: SPC25263-04

1.0 SCOPE

To establish a contract for hourly rental of various equipment with operators, to be used on an as-needed basis for snow removal, general grading, drainage, and other routine maintenance for the Pile Bay Road, near Iliamna, located in the Kodiak Aleutian District, for the State of Alaska, Department of Transportation & Public Facilities, Southcoast Region Maintenance & Operations (DOT/PF)

2.0 PROJECT REQUIREMENTS

- 2.1 All work shall be on a hourly equipment with operator rental basis to perform maintenance related work on State of Alaska facilities within the Pile Bay Road Maintenance Area boundaries, as designated by the DOT/PF representative. All work shall be in accordance with the State of Alaska Standard Specifications for Highway Construction Section 647, attached.
- 2.2 The Contractor must be capable of responding on a **twenty-four (24) hour** notice and shall provide a working phone number for 24-hour contact. Callouts will be made by a designated DOT/PF representative only.
- 2.3 The Department guarantees no minimum usage except that if called, the Contractor shall be paid a minimum of four (4) hours for the responding equipment.
- 2.4 All work shall be under the direction of a designated DOT/PF representative who will assign work and guide the Contractor's activities. The designated DOT/PF representative shall have the authority to terminate the use of any equipment, which is not maintained in good working condition or does not perform at a production capability consistent with maintenance standards. Because of the remote location of the work, the Contractor may be directed on occasion to perform work without on-site supervision. If no on-site supervision is available, all work performed must receive prior approval in writing. Failure to obtain prior approval may result in non-payment for services.

To receive prior approval, submit hourly equipment usage, hours that laborers will be required along with specific work description which includes route mile posts. This information may be faxed, e-mailed, or mailed to the District Superintendent, Sharon Clark (907-487-4952).

This requirement may be waived if the District Superintendent determines work needs to be done immediately. In this case approval will be given verbally. Verbal approval will be followed by written confirmation within 48 hours.

- 2.5 In the event of a disputed claim or differences between the Contractor and the Department resulting from the performance of this contract, these matters shall be resolved in accordance with the provisions contained in the AK Statute 36.30 Article 8.
- 2.6 The term of the contract shall be from <u>Date of Award</u> to <u>June 30, 2025</u>. The Department may renew this contract for <u>three (3)</u> additional one-year periods in substantial compliance with the same terms, conditions, and price, by mutual agreement in writing between the Contractor and the Department. Renewal option shall be exercised before <u>June 30</u> of the renewal year.
- 2.7 Little Davis-Bacon provisions for minimum wage rules apply under the construction bid items of this contract and do not apply under the maintenance bid items of this contract.
- 2.8 The initial annual road opening shall be no later than June 7, of each year of this contract.

SECTION 647

EQUIPMENT RENTAL

647-1.01 DESCRIPTION. This item consists of furnishing construction equipment, operated, fueled and maintained, on a rental basis for use in construction of extra or unanticipated work at the direction of the DOT M&O . Construction equipment is defined as that equipment actually used for performing the items of work specified and shall not include support equipment such as, but not limited to, hand tools, power tools, electric power generators, welders, small air compressors and other shop equipment needed for maintenance of the construction equipment.

The work is to be accomplished under the direction of the Engineer, and the Contractor's operations shall at all times be in accordance with the Engineer's instructions. These instructions by the DOT M&O shall be to the Contractor's supervisory personnel only, not to the operators or laborers. In no case shall these instructions by the DOT M&O be construed as making the Department liable for the Contractor's responsibility to prosecute the work in the safest and most expeditious manner.

647-2.01 EQUIPMENT FURNISHED. In the performance of this work, the Contractor shall furnish, operate, maintain, service, and repair equipment of the numbers, kinds, sizes, and capacities set forth on the Bid Schedule or as directed by the DOT M&O. The operation of equipment shall be by skilled, experienced operators familiar with the equipment.

The kinds, sizes, capacities, and other requirements set forth shall be understood to be minimum requirements. The number of pieces of equipment to be furnished and used shall be, as the DOT M&O considers necessary for economical and expeditious performance of the work. The equipment shall be used only at such times and places as the DOT M&O may direct.

Equipment shall be in first class working condition and capable of full output and production. The minimum ratings of various types of equipment shall be as manufactured and based on manufacturer's specifications. Alterations will not be considered acceptable in achieving the minimum rating. Equipment shall be replaced at any time when, in the opinion of the DOT M&O, their condition is below that normal for efficient output and production.

Equipment shall be fully operated, which shall be understood to include the operators, oilers, tenders, fuel, oil, air hose, lubrication, repairs, maintenance, insurance, and incidental items and expenses.

647-2.02 EQUIPMENT OPERATORS AND SUPERVISION PERSONNEL Equipment operators shall be competent and experienced and shall be capable of operating the equipment to its capacity. Personnel furnished by the Contractor shall be, and shall remain during the work hereunder, employees solely of the Contractor.

The Contractor shall furnish, without direct compensation, a job superintendent or Contractor's representative together with such other personnel as are needed for Union, State, or Federal requirements and in servicing, maintaining, repairing and caring for the equipment, tools, supplies, and materials provided by the Contractor and involved in the performance of the work. Also, the Contractor shall furnish, without direct compensation, such transportation as may be appropriate for the personnel.

647-3.01 CONSTRUCTION REQUIREMENTS. The performance of the work shall be according to the instructions of the DOT M&O, and with recognized standards and efficient methods.

The Contractor shall furnish equipment, tools, labor, and materials in the kinds, number, and at times directed by the DOT M&O and shall begin, continue, and stop any of the several operations involved in the work only as directed by the DOT M&O.

Normally, the work is to be done when weather conditions are reasonably favorable, 6 days per week, Mondays through Saturdays, except holidays.

The DOT M&O will begin recording time for payment each shift when the equipment begins work on the project. The serial number and brief description of each item of equipment listing in the bid schedule and the number of hours, or fractions thereof to the nearest one quarter hour, during' which equipment is actively engaged in construction of the project shall be recorded by the M&O Staff. Each day's activity will be recorded on a separate sheet or sheets, which shall be verified and signed by the Contractor's representative at the end of each shift, and a copy will be provided to the Contractor's representative.
