INSTRUCTIONS TO OFFERORS

The State of Alaska desires that all Offerors submitting quotes on construction contracts are given a fair and equal opportunity to compete. Offerors are required to follow these instructions:

REVIEW THE PROJECT DOCUMENTS: Most construction Projects in excess of \$1,000 will have some type of written documentation prepared expressly for the Work. If you are asked to submit a quote and no written information has been provided, you should ask the procurement Agency for written documentation. If the scope of services have been described to you verbally, and you are selected for Contract Award, you must ensure that the information of the services to be performed (scope of work) is put in writing prior to accepting the Contract. When providing a Quote, carefully review and consider all materials related to the solicitation and work of the contract. By submitting a quote the Offeror warrants that they are familiar with the Project requirements, have visited or otherwise examined the site, and are aware of the conditions to be encountered. Offeror's can verify the contents and completeness of their quote documents by contacting the procurement Agency individual named on the front of this form.

SUBMITTING THE QUOTE: The Quote must be submitted in one of the following formats as called for in the Invitation:

- 1. **ORALLY** if a verbal quote is solicited, the Offeror must provide, in addition to their quote amount and mailing address -- (1) their valid Alaska Business License number, (2) if applicable, a valid Contractor's Registration number, (3) their status as an Alaskan Bidder (Offeror), (4) their intended use of Alaskan products, (5) the carrier's name and policy number for their Workers' Comp Insurance (or a statement of sole proprietorship, if applicable), and (6) the Employer (Tax) Identification Number or Social Security Number. The Procurement Agency will enter this information on the quote schedule.
- 2. **WRITTEN** if a written quote is solicited, the Offeror must complete, in ink or typewritten, the *Small Procurement Quote Submittal*, Form SPC-002 hand-delivered or emailed to: srdotpfcontracts@Alaska.gov Failure to acknowledge receipt of addenda or to execute the form correctly and completely may disqualify the quote.

NOTE: The Department of Labor requires an Offeror to be licensed and registered for the required type of work prior to submitting a quote. If the procurement Agency determines the Offeror is improperly registered or licensed, their quote may be deemed nonresponsive.

<u>SUBCONTRACTOR LISTING:</u> Subcontractors intended to be utilized on this contract must be listed in the response to the solicitation. Work shall not be awarded to any subcontractor without prior approval from the procurement Agency. Subcontractors may be added or removed only as approved by the procurement Agency.

DETERMINATION OF THE LOWEST RESPONSIBLE QUOTE AND CONTRACT AWARD: Following receipt and determination of all **responsive** oral, written or sealed quotes, the procurement Agency will compare the quotes and determine the lowest Offeror. If the procurement Agency discovers a discrepancy between the unit price amount and the extended amount; the unit price amount will prevail. Conditioned quotes, unless expressly requested, will not be considered. When the quote schedule is composed of a basic amount with alternates, the procurement Agency will base its determination of the low quote and the amount of the Contract Award solely upon those quotes, basic and alternates, that are priced within the extent of available construction funds. Alternates will be considered for Award in the order listed, except that if the order of Offerors is not affected, the Award may include any combination of funded alternates, or none, as may be in the best interest of the procurement Agency.

When determining the lowest quote for *State-only* funded projects, the procurement Agency will also give a 5% Alaska Offeror's preference and an appropriate Alaska Products preference to quotes designating the applicability of a preference. To qualify for the Offeror's preference (per AS 36.30.170) the Offeror **must** (1) hold a current Alaska Business License, (2) submit the quote under the name appearing on the license, (3) have staffed and maintained a place of business within Alaska for the previous six months and (4) be incorporated or qualified to do business under the laws of the State. In addition, if the Offeror is a partnership or joint venture, all parties must meet the criteria to be eligible for the preference. A booklet fully describing the Alaska Preferences (Bidder, Offeror, Product, Disabilities, Veteran, Military Skills) program is available at http://www.commerce.state.ak.us/ded/dev/prodpref/prodpref.htm.

The procurement Agency will make a determination of **responsibility** as required by 2 AAC 12.500. If the lowest Offeror is declared responsible, the procurement Agency will execute the *Notice of Award / Notice to Proceed*, Form SPC-003, and send it to the Offeror for acknowledgement. If the lowest Offeror is found to be nonresponsible, this process will be repeated with the second lowest Offeror -- and so on until the lowest responsive and responsible Offeror is determined.

NOTICE OF AWARD AND PROTEST: A written notice will be provided on all Awards exceeding \$ 25,000 (2 AAC 12.400(h)). All protests must be filed with the Commissioner of the Procurement Agency (or designee) and copied to the Procurement Officer. Protest procedures are described in AS 36.30.560 and 2 AAC 12.695. The extent of the protest remedy is limited to quote preparation costs (AS 36.30.585).

3. INDEMNITY AND INSURANCE – The following insurance is required for all construction contracts: Article 1. Indemnification

The Contractor shall indemnify, hold harmless, and defend the contracting agency from and against any claim of, or liability for error, omission or negligent act of the Contractor under this agreement. The Contractor shall not be required to indemnify the contracting agency for a claim of, or liability for, the independent negligence of the contracting agency. If there is a claim of, or liability for, the joint negligent error or omission of the Contractor and the independent negligence of the Contracting agency, the indemnification and hold harmless obligation shall be apportioned on a comparative fault basis. "Contractor" and "Contracting agency", as used within this and the following article, include the employees, agents and other contractors who are directly responsible, respectively, to each. The term "independent negligence" is negligence other than in the Contracting agency's selection, administration, monitoring, or controlling of the Contractor and in approving or accepting the Contractor's work.


Article 2. Insurance

Without limiting contractor's indemnification, it is agreed that contractor shall purchase at its own expense and maintain in force at all times during the performance of services under this agreement the following policies of insurance. Where specific limits are shown, it is understood that they shall be the minimum acceptable limits. If the contractor's policy contains higher limits, the state shall be entitled to coverage to the extent of such higher limits. Certificates of Insurance must be furnished to the contracting officer prior to beginning work and must provide for a notice of cancellation, non-renewal, or material change of conditions in accordance with policy provisions. Failure to furnish satisfactory evidence of insurance or lapse of the policy is a material breach of this contract and shall be grounds for termination of the contractor's services. All insurance policies shall comply with and be issued by insurers licensed to transact the business of insurance under AS 21.

- **2.1 Workers' Compensation Insurance:** The Contractor shall provide and maintain, for all employees engaged in work under this contract, coverage as required by AS 23.30.045, and; where applicable, any other statutory obligations including but not limited to Federal U.S.L. & H. and Jones Act requirements. The policy must waive subrogation against the State.
- **2.2 Commercial General Liability Insurance**: The State of Alaska, Department of Transportation and Public Facilities shall provide a policy that will protect the state against tort claims for negligent acts of the Contractor. This policy will only cover duties and services performed under this contract. The policy is only provided to those Contractors who are unable to secure a policy in the commercial market. For those Contractors who can obtain a policy in the performance of services under this agreement, please provide with minimum coverage limits of \$300,000 combined single limit per claim.
- **2.3** Commercial Automobile Liability Insurance: covering all vehicles used by the Contractor in the performance of services under this agreement with minimum coverage limits of \$300,000 combined single limit per claim.

FEDERAL EEO BID CONDITIONS

NOTICE OF REQUIREMENT FOR AFFIRMATIVE ACTION TO ENSURE EQUAL EMPLOYMENT OPPORTUNITY (EXECUTIVE ORDER 11246)

- 1. The Offeror's or Bidder's attention is called to the "Equal Opportunity Clause" and the "Standard Federal Equal Employment Opportunity Construction Contract Specifications" set forth herein.
- 2. The goals and timetables for minority and female participation, expressed in percentage terms for the Contractor's aggregate workforce in each trade on all construction work in the covered area, are as follows:

These goals are applicable to all of the Contractor's construction work (whether or not it is Federal or federally-assisted) performed in the covered area. If the Contractor performs construction work in a geographical area located outside of the covered area, it shall apply the goals established for such geographical area where the work is actually performed. With regard to this second area, the Contractor also is subject to the goals for both its federally involved and non-federally involved construction.

The Contractor's compliance with the Executive Order and the regulations in 41 CFR Part 60-4 shall be based on its implementation of the Equal Opportunity Clause, specific affirmative action obligations required by the specifications set forth in 41 CFR 60-4.3(a), and its efforts to meet the goals. The hours of minority and female employment and training must be substantially uniform throughout the length of the contract, and in each trade, and the Contractor shall make a good faith effort to employ minorities and women evenly on each of its projects. The transfer of minority or female employees or trainees from Contractor to Contractor or from project to project for the sole purpose of meeting the Contractor's goals shall be a violation of the contract, the Executive Order and the regulations in 41 CFR Part 60-4. Compliance with the goals will be measured against the total work hours performed.

- 3. The Contractor shall provide written notification to the Director of the Office of Federal Contract Compliance Programs (OFCCP) within 10 working days of award of any construction subcontract in excess of \$10,000 at any tier for construction work under the contract resulting from this solicitation. The notification shall list the name, address, and telephone number of the subcontractor; employer identification number of the subcontractor; estimated dollar amount of the subcontract; estimated starting and completion dates of the subcontract; and the geographical area in which the subcontract is to be performed.
- 4. As used in this notice and in the contract resulting from this solicitation, the "covered area" is **the State of Alaska.**

STANDARD FEDERAL EQUAL EMPLOYMENT OPPORTUNITY CONSTRUCTION CONTRACT SPECIFICATIONS FOR ALL NON-EXEMPT FEDERAL AND FEDERALLY-ASSISTED CONSTRUCTION CONTRACTS TO BE AWARDED IN THE STATE OF ALASKA

- 1. <u>Definitions</u>. As used in these specifications:
 - a. "Covered area" means the geographical area described in the solicitation from which this contract resulted;
 - b. "Director" means Director, Office of Federal Contract Compliance Programs (OFCCP), U.S. Department of Labor, or any person to whom the Director delegates authority;
 - c. **"Employer identification number"** means the Federal social security number used on the Employer's Quarterly Federal Tax Return, U.S. Treasury Department Form 941.
 - d. "Minority" includes:
 - (1) Black (all persons having origins in any of the Black African racial groups not of Hispanic origin);
 - (2) Hispanic (all persons of Mexican, Puerto Rican, Cuban, Central or South American, or other Spanish culture or origin, regardless of race);
 - (3) Asian and Pacific Islander (all persons having origins in any of the original peoples of the Far East.
 - Southeast Asia, the Indian Subcontinent, or the Pacific Islands); and
 - (4) American Indian or Alaska Native (all persons having origins in any of the original peoples of North America and maintaining identifiable tribal affiliations through membership and participation or community identification).
- 2. Whenever the Contractor, or any subcontractor at any tier, subcontracts a portion of the work involving any construction trade, it shall physically include in each subcontract in excess of \$10,000 the provisions of these specifications and the Notice which contains the applicable goals for minority and female participation and which is set forth in the solicitations from which this contract resulted.
- 3. If the Contractor is participating (pursuant to 41 CFR 60-4.5) in a Hometown Plan approved by the U.S. Department of Labor in the covered area, either individually or through an association, its affirmative action obligations on all work in the Plan area (including goals and timetables) shall be in accordance with that Plan for those trades which have unions participating in the Plan. Contractors must be able to demonstrate their participation in and compliance with the provisions of any such Hometown Plan. Each Contractor or subcontractor participating in an approved Plan is individually required to comply with its obligations under the EEO clause, and to make a good faith effort to each goal under the Plan in each trade in which it has employees. The overall good faith performance by other Contractors or subcontractors toward a goal in an approved Plan does not excuse any covered Contractor's or subcontractor's failure to take good faith efforts to achieve the Plan goals and timetables.
- 4. The Contractor shall implement the specific affirmative action standards provided in paragraphs 7a through 7p of these specifications. The goals set forth in the solicitation from which this contract resulted are expressed as percentages of the total hours of employment and training of minority and female utilization the Contractor should reasonably be able to achieve in each construction trade in which it has employees in the covered area. Covered construction contractors performing construction work in a geographical areas where they do not have a Federal or federally assisted construction contract shall apply the minority and female goals established for the geographical area where the work is being performed. Goals are published periodically in the Federal Register in notice form, and such notices may be obtained from any Office of Federal Contract Compliance

Programs office or from Federal procurement contracting officers. The Contractor is expected to make substantially uniform progress in meeting its goals in each craft during the period specified.

- 5. Neither the provisions of any collective bargaining agreement, nor the failure by a union with whom the Contractor has a collective bargaining agreement, to refer to either minorities or women shall excuse the Contractor's obligations under these specifications, Executive Order 11246, or the regulations promulgated pursuant thereto.
- 6. In order for the nonworking training hours of apprentices and trainees to be counted in meeting the goals, such apprentices and trainees must be employed by the Contractor during the training period, and the Contractor must have made a commitment to employ the apprentices and trainees at the completion of their training, subject to the availability of employment opportunities. Trainees must be trained pursuant to training programs approved by the U.S. Department of Labor.
- 7. The Contractor shall take specific affirmative actions to ensure equal employment opportunity. The evaluation of the Contractor's compliance with these specifications shall be based upon its effort to achieve maximum results from its actions. The Contractor shall document these efforts fully, and shall implement affirmative action steps at least as extensive as the following:
 - a. Ensure and maintain a working environment free of harassment, intimidation, and coercion at all sites, and in all facilities at which the Contractor's employees are assigned to work. The Contractor, where possible, will assign two or more women to each construction project. The Contractor shall specifically ensure that all foremen, superintendents, and other onsite supervisory personnel are aware of and carry out the Contractor's obligation to maintain such a working environment, with specific attention to minority or female individuals working at such sites or in such facilities.
 - b. Establish and maintain a current list of minority and female recruitment sources, provide written notification to minority and female recruitment sources and to community organizations when the Contractor or its unions have employment opportunities available, and maintain a record of the organizations' responses.
 - c. Maintain a current file of the names, addresses and telephone numbers of each minority and female off-thestreet applicant and minority or female referral from a union, a recruitment source or community organization and of what action was taken with respect to each such individual. If such individual was sent to the union hiring hall for referral and was not referred back to the Contractor by the union or, if referred, not employed by the Contractor, this shall be documented in the file with the reason therefor, along with whatever additional actions the Contractor may have taken.
 - d. Provide immediate written notification to the Director when the union or unions with which the Contractor has a collective bargaining agreement has not referred to the Contractor a minority person or woman sent by the Contractor, or when the Contractor has other information that the union referral process has impeded the Contractor's efforts to meet its obligations.
 - e. Develop on-the-job training opportunities and/or participate in training programs for the area which expressly include minorities and women, including upgrading programs and apprenticeship and trainee programs relevant to the Contractor's employment needs, especially those programs funded or approved by the Department of Labor. The Contractor shall provide notice of these programs to the sources compiled under 7b above.
 - f. Disseminate the Contractor's EEO policy by providing notice of the policy to unions and training programs and requesting their cooperation in assisting the Contractor in meeting its EEO obligations; by including it in any policy manual and collective bargaining agreement; by publicizing it in the company newspaper, annual report, etc.; by specific review of the policy with all management personnel and with all minority and female employees at least once a year; and by posting the company EEO policy on bulletin boards accessible to all employees at each location where construction work is performed.

- g. Review, at least annually, the company's EEO policy and affirmative action obligations under these specifications with all employees having any responsibility for hiring, assignment, layoff, termination or other employment decisions including specific review of these items with onsite supervisory personnel such as superintendents, general foreman, etc., prior to the initiation of construction work at any job site. A written record shall be made and maintained identifying the time and place of these meetings, persons attending, subject matter discussed, and dispositions of the subject matter.
- h. Disseminate the Contractor's EEO policy externally by including it in any advertising in the news media, specifically including minority and female news media, and providing written notification to and discussing the Contractor's EEO policy with other Contractors and Subcontractors with whom the Contractor does or anticipates doing business.
- i. Direct its recruitment efforts, both oral and written, to minority, female and community organizations, to schools with minority and female students and to minority and female recruitment and training organizations serving the Contractor's recruitment area and employment needs. Not later than one month prior to the date for the acceptance of applications for apprenticeship or other training by any recruitment source, the Contractor shall send written notification to organizations such as the above, describing the openings, screening procedures, and tests to be used in the selection process.
- j. Encourage present minority and female employees to recruit other minority persons and women and, where reasonable, provide after school, summer and vacation employment to minority and female youth both on the site and in other areas of a Contractor's workforce.
- k. Validate all tests and other selection requirements where there is an obligation to do so under 41 CFR Part 60-3.
- 1. Conduct, at least annually, an inventory and evaluation of all minority and female personnel for promotional opportunities and encourage these employees to seek or to prepare for, through appropriate training, etc., such opportunities.
- m. Ensure that seniority practices, job classifications, work assignments and other personnel practices do not have a discriminatory effect by continually monitoring all personnel and employment related activities to ensure that the EEO policy and the Contractor's obligations under these specifications are being carried out.
- n. Ensure that all facilities and company activities are nonsegregated except that separate or single-user toilet and necessary changing facilities shall be provided to assure privacy between the sexes.
- o. Document and maintain a record of all solicitations of offers for subcontractors from minority and female construction contractors and suppliers, including circulations of solicitations to minority and female contractor associations and other business associations.
- p. Conduct a review, at least annually, of all supervisors' adherence to and performance under the Contractor's EEO policies and affirmative action obligations.
- 8. Contractors are encouraged to participate in voluntary associations which assist in fulfilling one or more of their affirmative action obligations (7a through 7p). The efforts of a contractor association, joint contractor-union, contractor-community, or other similar group of which the Contractor is a member and participant, may be asserted as fulfilling any or more of its obligations under 7a through 7p of these specifications provided that the Contractor actively participates in the group, makes every effort to assure that the group has a positive impact on the employment of minorities and women in the industry, ensures that the concrete benefits of the program are reflected in the Contractor's minority and female work force participation, makes a good faith effort to meet its individual goals and timetables, and can provide access to documentation which demonstrates the effectiveness of actions taken on behalf of the Contractor. The obligation to comply, however, is the Contractor's and failure of such a group to fulfill an obligation shall not be a defense for the Contractor's noncompliance.

- 9. A single goal for minorities and a separate single goal for women have been established. The Contractor, however, is required to provide equal employment opportunity and to take affirmative action for all minority groups, both male and female, and all women, both minority and non-minority. Consequently, the Contractor may be in violation of the Executive Order if a particular group is employed in a substantially disparate manner (for example, even though the Contractor has achieved its goals for women generally, the Contractor may be in violation of the Executive Order if a specific minority group of women is underutilized).
- 10. The Contractor shall not use the goals and timetables or affirmative action standards to discriminate against any person because of race, color, religion, sex, sexual orientation, gender identity, or national origin.



SCOPE OF WORK (SOW)

King Salmon- Naknek River Watershed Culvert Replacement Drilling and Traffic Control Services Project No. SFHWY00638

Project Description:

The Alaska Department of Transportation and Public Facilities (DOT&PF) Southcoast Region Materials (SRM) requests bids to provide Drilling Services for a geotechnical subsurface investigation at two sites along the Alaska Peninsula Highway, between King Salmon and Naknek, Alaska. Site 1 is at Mile Post 14.233 at the Eskimo Creek crossing (Figure 1). Site 2 is at Mile Post 11.013 at an unnamed creek crossing (Figure 2). The investigation will provide soils data for the design of new culverts and wingwalls. A total of 6 borings are planned for this investigation and estimated to take 7 days to complete. Drilling will be supervised by DOT&PF Southcoast Region geologists. DOT&PF will obtain any necessary permits, perform the utility locates, and provide traffic control services. The planned start date is on or about November 5, 2025.

Drilling Description:

Drilling at Site 1 will be completed from the roadway (Figure 1) and include four test holes:

- 2, 60-foot deep borings will be advanced with hollow stem augers. Modified penetration tests using a 3" O.D. split spoon driven with a 340 pound auto hammer will be taken from 0-2 feet and 2-4 feet. Starting at 5 feet SPTs driven with a 140 pound auto hammer will be taken at 5-foot intervals to the target depth of 60 feet.
- 2, 60-foot deep borings will be advanced with hollow stem augers without sampling to a depth of 35 feet. Starting at 35 feet SPTs will be taken at 5 foot intervals to the target depth of 60 feet.

Drilling at Site 2 will also be completed from the roadway (Figure 2) and include 2 test holes with target depths of 45 feet. Modified penetration tests using a 3" O.D. split spoon driven with a 340 pound auto hammer will be taken from 0-2 feet and 2-4 feet. Starting at 5 feet SPTs driven with a 140 pound auto hammer will be taken at 5-foot intervals to the target depth of 45 feet.

Drilling is anticipated to be completed using hollow stem augers. However, if heaving sands are encountered the Contractor should be prepared to use a water or mud rotary method to control the heave. See discussion below in Drilling Equipment and Supplies.

Traffic control at both sites will be provided DOT&PF M&O forces.

Drilling Equipment and Supplies:

General

- Provide all necessary labor, material and equipment to drill test holes to the depths as indicated in the previous sections.
- Provide the necessary equipment and at least four, 24-inch-long split spoon samplers to conduct Standard Penetration Tests (SPT) using a 1.375-inch I.D. x 2-inch O.D. split spoon sampler driven by a 140-pound automatic hammer (ASTM D 1586). This includes a

- minimum of two new or unused split barrel samplers, ten extra plastic sample retainers, and five extra drive shoes.
- To conduct Modified Penetration Tests (MPT), provide two, 3-inch O.D., 24-inch-long split spoon samplers with ten extra sample retainers and five extra drive shoes, in case larger sample sizes are necessary. This sampler is to be driven by a 340-pound automatic hammer.
- An automatic hammer shall already be mounted to the drill mast and ready to deploy when the drill rig arrives on site. No automatic hammer will be accepted that has to be suspended from a cable, and hydraulic lines have to be attached, before it is operational. The hammer must be equipped with both a 340- and 140-pound weight to allow completion of either the SPT or MPT.
- The Contractor shall be responsible for providing backfill for the test holes when drill cuttings are not available to be used as backfill. No peat or wet silt will be placed back into the hole as backfill.
- The Contractor shall be responsible for proper compaction of cuttings placed back into the boring such as back-spinning augers while placing cuttings back into the boring. The Contractor shall use a 6-inch diameter steel plate attached to drill rods to compact the soils and asphalt cold patch in the boring. Compaction shall be accomplished by driving the drill rods (with an anvil attachment) using the automatic hammer to ensure the soils in the bore hole are well compacted.
- The Contractor shall have on site a spill kit consisting of a 35-gallon drum that contains (at a minimum) two Tyvek Suits with plastic gloves and boot covers, five 45-gallon heavy duty trash bags, ten feet of oil sorbent boom, one hundred oil sorbent pads (2 feet square, high absorbency), and a 5-gallon bucket of oil absorbent material.
- A large diameter "cookie cutter" is required to cut at least a 12-inch hole in the asphalt surface before using hollow stem auger (or the other various methods mentioned above) to drill into the underlying soil.
- Provide cold patch asphalt for each test hole drilled through pavement. Each patched test hole will require a minimum 6-inch depth of cold patch. Cold patching shall be accomplished immediately after the drilling is completed and backfilled.
- If heaving sands are encountered the Contractor shall be prepared to use water or mud rotary drilling methods (casing advancer, tricone and casing) with a recirculation tank.
- Control run-off water at all drill sites using straw boom, silt fence, trenching, sump pump, or other approved means. Placement will be at the approval of the supervising Engineering Geologist.
- Support trucks and other equipment will need to be parked on the highway adjacent to the drill site.

Drill Crew Requirements:

A Drill Crew of at least two individuals is required. The lead driller shall have at least three years of experience operating the type of drill rig used on this project.

Work Schedule:

• Planned start date is on or about November 5, 2025. DOT&PF will coordinate start of onsite work with the contractor after NTP is authorized.

- 7 days are estimated to perform this work. However, it is typical for drilling projects to end a few days ahead or behind schedule.
- Exact work hours will be established by the supervising geologist but will generally be between 7:00 am to 7:00 pm each day.
- Work shall be continuous until all drilling is complete. Weekend hours will be required. Contractor(s) shall not pull off the project once work has commenced.

Mechanical Failure Payments:

- No payment will be made while work is halted due to mechanical failure of the Contractor(s) equipment or to obtain/fabricate supplies required as part of this contract. This includes:
 - o Crew(s) labor
 - o Transportation costs to leave site and return (if necessary)
 - o Shipping costs for parts to repair or fabricate equipment.
 - o Labor time to repair or fabricate equipment.

Payment:

- Payment is based on the established daily rate. The daily rate is based on a ten (10) hour day.
- Only on-site time is compensated, see Mechanical Failures above.
- Note that estimated drilling days are for bidding purposes only and not guaranteed. Payment will be based on actual number of drilling days.
- A Daily Log Sheet will be filled out by the supervising geologist to document the hours spent performing work. A copy can be made available for the contractor upon request. This document will be the basis of payment.
