Changes to the RFP:

1. On Page 4 of the RFP, delete the following in the RFP and its entirety:

"The Department of Corrections, Division of Administrative Services, has not established a firm budget for this contract. Funds are limited, and negotiations may be necessary depending upon the cost of the proposal submitted.

Approval or continuation of a contract resulting from this RFP is dependent upon legislative appropriation of funding and programmatic needs"

Replace with:

"Department of Corrections, Division of Administration, estimates a budget of between \$1,500,000.00 and \$2,500,000.00 for completion of this project.

Approval or continuation of a contract resulting from this RFP is depended upon legislative appropriation of funding and programmatic needs"

2. Proposal deadline has been extended until October 15, 2025, Wednesday 2:00 p.m. local time.

Q&A:

Question: Is the estimated number of exams annually approximately 500? Is there a breakdown of volume per location?

Answer: The Department of Corrections estimates that approximately 250 to 500 examinations are conducted annually. There is no detailed breakdown of volume per individual location. However, most referrals come from Anchorage and its surrounding areas along the road system, including Eagle River, Palmer, and Wasilla.

Question: Contract Term, is there an opportunity to review pricing before renewal?

Answer: This is a firm-fixed-price contract throughout the completion of this project.

Question: Contract Type, is there an opportunity to review pricing before renewal?

Answer: Per SEC. 3.04 CONTRACT TYPE, this is a <u>firm-fixed-price</u> contract.

Question: If using a subcontractor, their price rate may vary periodically. Are we able to adjust pricing to align with the subcontractors' rates?

<u>Answer:</u> It is the responsibility of the contractor, not the State, to pay subcontractors. The offeror's proposed unit costs and total costs should factor in direct and indirect costs and (if used) subcontractor rates.
