

NOTICE OF PUBLIC COMMENT PERIOD REGARDING REGULATIONS OF THE
ALASKA STATE COMMISSION FOR HUMAN RIGHTS

BRIEF DESCRIPTION

The Alaska State Commission for Human Rights is holding public comment in association with Administrative Order No. 360.

The State Commission for Human Rights, in response to Administrative Order No. 360 dated August 4, 2025, is holding a public comment period regarding existing regulations within 6 AAC 30.011 – 30.990.

You may comment with ideas, suggestions, and input by submitting written comments to the Alaska State Commission for Human Rights at 1901 Bragaw Street, Suite 300, Anchorage, AK 99508. Additionally, the Alaska State Commission for Human Rights will accept comments by electronic mail through Kathryn DuFresne, Law Office Assistant, at kathryn.dufresne@alaska.gov. Comments may also be submitted through the Alaska Online Public Notice System, by accessing this notice on the system and using the comment link. The comments must be received no later than 4:00 pm on January 30, 2026.


You may submit written questions relevant to the proposed action to Rob Corbisier by email at robert.corbisier@alaska.gov or by letter to the Alaska State Commission for Human Rights, 1901 Bragaw Street, Suite 300, Anchorage, AK 99508. The questions must be received at least 10 days before the end of the public comment period. The Alaska State Commission for Human Rights will compile its response to substantially similar questions and make the questions and responses available on the Alaska Online Public Notice System and <https://humanrights.alaska.gov>.

After the public comment period ends, the State Commission for Human Rights will document and publish public feedback and agency responses. You should comment during the time allowed if your interests could be affected.

The Alaska State Commission for Human Rights is not currently proposing any regulation change and there are no draft regulations prepared for public comment under the Administrative Procedure Act at this time. If the Alaska State Commission for Human Rights undertakes revisions to these regulations, there will be an additional opportunity to comment on the proposed regulation changes that are released for public review and comment under the Administrative Procedure Act.
