TITLE OF THE PROJECT: ARTIFICIAL INTELLIGENCE SOFTWARE FOR CRIMINAL JUSTICE DATA MINING

Introduction:

The State of Alaska is seeking information from qualified vendors with experience in secure data-mining, analytical review, and automated reporting solutions. This Request for Information (RFI) is issued solely for the purpose of conducting market research and identifying vendors capable of supporting a confidential, time-sensitive data review initiative.

Background Information:

The State anticipates a near-term need for a secure, high-accuracy system capable of reviewing large volumes of structured and semi-structured records maintained within controlled government environments. The project will require the application of jurisdiction-specific rules to identify records meeting defined criteria, with results produced on a recurring and accelerated schedule.

The anticipated solution must operate within strict security and confidentiality constraints, including handling sensitive government data, supporting auditability, and producing standardized decision-support reports. The turnaround timeline for deployment and operational use is expected to be compressed, requiring vendors with a demonstrated ability to deliver production-ready systems on an expedited basis.

The solution is expected to involve access to or processing of highly sensitive government records maintained within criminal-justice or law-enforcement-regulated environments. Vendors should anticipate that project personnel and systems may be required to comply with FBI Criminal Justice Information Services (CJIS) Security Policy requirements, including background checks, access controls, audit logging, and data-handling restrictions.

Accordingly, the State is seeking responses only from vendors that have a demonstrated history of working directly with law enforcement or criminal justice agencies and of handling CJIS-regulated data in operational production environments within the last five (5) years. Vendors without prior experience operating under CJIS requirements or established relationships with criminal justice agencies are unlikely to be a suitable fit for this project.

The State is particularly interested in solutions that leverage artificial intelligence, machine learning, or other advanced computational techniques to efficiently apply complex criteria across large datasets with consistency, accuracy, and auditability.

The State anticipates a need for a solution that can be configured, validated, and made operational on an accelerated timeline, potentially requiring a production-ready deployment on or before June 1, 2026. Vendors responding to this RFI should consider whether their solutions can reasonably support such a timeframe.

This RFI is intentionally high-level. Certain details regarding the precise policy application, subject matter, and end-use decision process are not disclosed at this stage in order to protect confidentiality and deliberative interests.

Response Information:

Vendors who believe they can provide services or solutions responsive to the needs described above are invited to submit a written response. Responses should include, at a minimum:

- A brief description of the vendor's experience with data-mining, analytical review, or AI-assisted decision-support systems;
- Experience operating in secure or regulated data environments (e.g., government, justice, health, or similarly sensitive domains);
- High-level description of the proposed technical approach and deployment model;
- Experience meeting accelerated or fixed delivery timelines;
- Any assumptions, prerequisites, or constraints relevant to the vendor's solution.

This Request for Information does not constitute a solicitation and does not obligate the State to issue a subsequent procurement or to purchase any goods or services. Responses will be used solely to assess market capabilities and potential availability of qualified vendors.
