- I. **Name:** Operations Material Site (OMS) 106-1 along the Trans-Alaska Pipeline Right-of-Way.
- II. **Reason for Mineral Order:** This Mineral Order (MO) is based on the attached Commissioner's Administrative Finding *and* applicable statutes.
- III. **Authority:** AS 38.05.185 and AS 38.05.300.
- IV. **Location and Legal Description:** The region affected by this mineral order consists of approximately 157 acres located along the Trans-Alaska Pipeline System Right-of-Way within Section 28 of Township 35 North, Range 10 West, Fairbanks Meridian.

This action also authorizes changes to MO 1334 to align with the legal description of the material site upon its designation and any future amendments to the designated material site without a formal amendment to this order.




