Question & Answer:

Question 1: Since this program would be operated for the Department of Corrections under AS 33.30, we understand it may fall under 7 AAC 70.140 rather than the general community behavioral health provider accreditation track in 7 AAC 70.150. Can you confirm whether the Department Approval Certificate for a DOC-operated program is obtained through a memorandum of agreement (or similar arrangement) with DOC, rather than full national accreditation through DOH DBH?

Answer: *The offeror does not need to be nationally accredited.*

Question 2: Is there a typical timeline for a new offeror to obtain this certificate, and can that process begin during the proposal period, or only after contract award?

Answer: *The offeror does not need to be nationally accredited. So, no timeline is needed.*

Question 3: For staff who hold provisional QAP approval and a department-approved SUD Training Plan, is there a cap on how many provisional (versus full) QAP staff can be assigned to the contract at one time?

Answer: *No cap on provisional QAP staff.*

Question 4: Is the DOC interested in virtual health proposals for the services requested, or is the DOC only seeking on-site services?

Answer: *This program is for on-site services only.*
