This patent is issued by the UNITED STATES, Department of the Interior, Bureau of Land Management, 222 West Seventh Avenue, #13, Anchorage, Alaska 99513-7504, as GRANTOR, to St. Michael Native Corporation, P.O. Box 59049, St. Michael, Alaska 99659, as GRANTEE, for lands in the Cape Nome Recording District.

WHEREAS

St. Michael Native Corporation

is entitled to a patent pursuant to Sec. 14(a) of the Alaska Native Claims Settlement Act of December 18, 1971, 43 U.S.C. § 1613(a), of the surface estate in the following-described lands, a portion of which was transferred by Interim Conveyance Nos. 495, 914, 1629, 1644, and 1647 issued April 9, 1982, September 28, 1984, August 11, 1995, November 9, 1995, and November 8, 1995, respectively:

NOW KNOW YE, that there is, therefore, granted by the UNITED STATES OF AMERICA, unto the above-named corporation the surface estate in the lands above described; TO HAVE AND TO HOLD the said estate with all the rights, privileges, immunities, and appurtenances, of whatsoever nature, thereunto belonging, unto the said corporation, its successors and assigns, forever.

EXCEPTING AND RESERVING TO THE UNITED STATES from the lands so granted:

1. The subsurface estate therein, and all rights, privileges, immunities, and appurtenances, of whatsoever nature, accruing unto said estate pursuant to the

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Alaska Native Claims Settlement Act of December 18, 1971, 43 U.S.C. § 1613(f); and

2. Pursuant to Sec. 17(b) of the Alaska Native Claims Settlement Act of December 18, 1971, 43 U.S.C. § 1616(b) (1976), the following public easements, referenced by Easement Identification Number (EIN) on the easement maps, copies of which can be found in the Bureau of Land Management's public land records, are reserved to the United States. All easements are subject to applicable Federal, State, or Municipal corporation regulation. The following is a listing of uses allowed for each type of easement. Any uses which are not specifically listed are prohibited.

25 Foot Trail - The uses allowed on a twenty-five (25) foot wide trail easement are: travel by foot, dogsleds, animals, snowmobiles, two- and three-wheeled vehicles, and small all-terrain vehicles (ATV's) (less than 3,000 lbs. Gross Vehicle Weight (GVW)).

One Acre Site - The uses allowed on a site easement are: vehicle parking (e.g., aircraft, boats, all-terrain vehicles (ATV's), snowmobiles, cars, trucks), temporary camping, and loading or unloading. Temporary camping, loading, or unloading shall be limited to 24 hours.

- a. (EIN 2 D1, D9) An easement for an existing access trail twenty-five (25) feet in width from the village of St. Michael in Sec. 24, T. 23 S., R. 18 W., Kateel River Meridian, southwesterly to public land and surrounding villages. The uses allowed are those listed above for a twenty-five (25) foot wide trail. The season of use will be limited to winter.
- b. (EIN 2a D1, D9) An easement for an existing access trail twenty-five (25) feet in width from trail EIN 2 D1, D9 in Sec. 25, T. 23 S., R. 18 W., Kateel River Meridian, easterly to public land and on to Unalakleet. The uses allowed are those listed above for a twenty-five (25) foot wide trail easement. This easement is subject to the State's assertion of property interest in the Unalakleet – St. Michael Trail, RST 218, if valid.
- c. (EIN 5 C5) A one (1) acre site easement upland of the mean high tide line in Sec. 6, T. 23 S., R. 18 W., Kateel River Meridian, on the south shore of Norton Sound. The uses allowed are those listed above for a one (1) acre site.



- d. (EIN 6 C5) A one (1) acre site easement upland of the mean high tide line in Sec. 35, T. 23 S., R. 17 W., Kateel River Meridian, at Five-Mile Cove near Five-Mile Point. The uses allowed are those listed above for a one (1) acre site.
- e. (EIN 6a C5) An easement for a proposed access trail twenty-five (25) feet in width from site EIN 6 C5 in Sec. 35, T. 23 S., R. 17 W., Kateel River Meridian, southerly to trail EIN 2a D1, D9. The uses allowed are those listed above for a twenty-five (25) foot wide trail. The season of use will be limited to winter.
- f. (EIN 101 J) A combination of miscellaneous easements for an existing U.S. Coast Guard navigation aid known as Egg Island Light located in Lot 2, U.S. Survey No. 12417, Alaska (Section 3, T. 22 S., R. 16 W., Kateel River Meridian), at Latitude 63°36'40" N., and Longitude 161°44'35" W. The easements include a circular site, having a radius of 250 feet, whose center is the navigation aid and the right of safe ingress and egress to the site. In addition, an easement is reserved for the airspace, through an arc having a 250-foot radius, whose center is the navigation aid, from 0° true north, clockwise, to 360° true north. The uses allowed include those uses associated with the construction, reconstruction, operation, and maintenance of the navigational aid, the right to clear and keep the lands clear from any obstruction infringing upon or penetrating the airspace, the right to remove buildings or obstructions of any type which may infringe upon or extend into the airspace, and the right to prohibit use on and remove from the lands beneath the airspace any object which would create interference for users of the navigation aid. Use is limited to the United States Government and its authorized agents, contractors and assigns.

THE GRANT OF THE ABOVE-DESCRIBED LANDS IS SUBJECT TO:

- 1. Valid existing rights therein, if any, including, but not limited to those created by any lease, contract, permit, right-of-way, or easement, and the right of the lessee, contractee, permittee, or grantee to the complete enjoyment of all rights, privileges, and benefits thereby granted to him. Further, pursuant to Sec. 17(b)(2) of the Alaska Native Claims Settlement Act of December 18, 1971 (ANCSA), 43 U.S.C. § 1616(b)(2) (1976), any valid existing right recognized by ANCSA shall continue to have whatever right of access as is now provided for under existing law; and



2. Requirements of Sec. 14(c) of the Alaska Native Claims Settlement Act of December 18, 1971, 43 U.S.C. § 1613(c), as amended, that the grantee hereunder convey those portions, if any, of the lands hereinabove granted, as are prescribed in said section.



IN TESTIMONY WHEREOF, the undersigned authorized officer of the Bureau of Land Management, in accordance with the provisions of the Act of June 17, 1948 (62 Stat. 476), has, in the name of the United States, caused these letters to be made Patent, and the Seal of the Bureau to be hereunto affixed.
