(10) has a pest management plan and keeps the facility free of insects, vermin, mold, and mildew;

(12) protects all collection areas with both locks and alarm systems. ^{lowercase} A system must be in place that tracks all keys and security codes and identifies who is authorized to be in collections storage areas;

(14) maintains a visitor log or sign-in sheet in order to track the use of collections by non-museum staff;

(20) stores each object properly. Archives should be in archival (acid-free) boxes

and folders. Objects and artifacts should be in ethafoam-lined boxes, non-gassing polyethylene reclosable bags, glass vials, or other state of the art containers. Each object or artifact should be cradled, supported, or positioned so that damage will not occur by its own weight over time or

by the opening and closing of sliding drawers;

(21) has a custodial plan that addresses daily waste collection, periodic cleaning,

and sanitation procedures;

(22) safely stores flammable liquids away from all archival materials;

(23) maintains accession files that contain the following information:

(A) transmittal documentation that certifies that the specific collection, object, or archive was acquired and transferred by legitimate means. This may include copy of federal collecting permit, deed of gift, will, and testament, or sales receipt;

(B) a receiving report that ensures that the specific collection falls within the repository's scope of collections statement and is approved by a designated receiving official (usually a curator or museum director);

(C) pertinent contextual information including field notes, maps, photographs, conservation or preparation records, and related archives; and

(D) administrative documentation that relates to the past, present, and future status of the collection;

(24) maintains conservation and preparation documentation that records techniques, chemicals, and treatments that have been applied to the objects, artifacts, or archives over time;

(25) has a system in place to monitor the status and location of objects while they are checked out of collections storage. This may include outgoing loans or removal for study, conservation, preparation, or exhibit;

(26) ensures that all objects and archives display a unique catalog identification that includes the repository acronym and unique catalog number and identifies ownership;

(27) has a system in place to conduct a periodic inventory of its holdings. While complete inventories are ideal, random sample inventories are sufficient. (Eff. 3/6/2015)

We have reviewed the attached regulations from the State Board of Education and Early Development against the statutory standards of the Administrative Procedure Act. I have reviewed this project under a specific delegation dated February 3, 2015 from the Regulations Attorney. Implementing an amendment to AS 14.57.010 and the enactment of AS 14.57.012 under ch. 21, SLA 2014 (SCS CSHB 154(EDC)), the regulations establish requirements and procedures for a museum, a cultural center, or an affiliated research component of a museum or cultural center to be designated a natural and cultural history repository.

We find no legal problems. This memorandum constitutes the written statement of approval under AS 44.62.060(b) and (c) that authorizes your office to file the attached regulations.

The October 1, 2014 public notice and the February 3, 2015 certification of adoption order both state that this action is not expected to require an increased appropriation. Therefore, a fiscal note under AS 44.62.195 is not required.

We have made some technical corrections to conform the regulations in accordance with AS 44.62.125. The corrections are shown on the attached copy of the regulations.

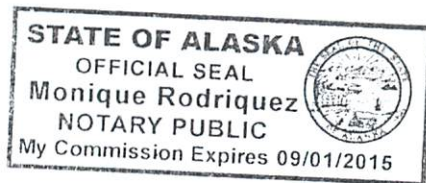

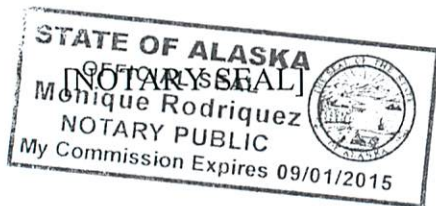



**NOTICE OF PROPOSED CHANGES IN THE REGULATIONS OF
THE DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION & EARLY DEVELOPMENT**

BRIEF DESCRIPTION

The Department of Education & Early Development proposes new regulations by which the Alaska State Museum will designate other Alaska museums or cultural centers as repositories of natural and cultural history materials.

The Department of Education & Early Development proposes to adopt regulation changes in Title 4 of the Alaska Administrative Code to amend 4 AAC 58. The proposed regulations implement AS 14.57.012, which was enacted by the 2014 legislature and authorizes the Alaska State Museum to designate other institutions as repositories of natural and cultural history. The regulations may address the following:

- o Designation of natural and cultural history repositories, including application process, alternative accreditation requirements, assurances by institutions, state review, and grounds for revocation of the designation.

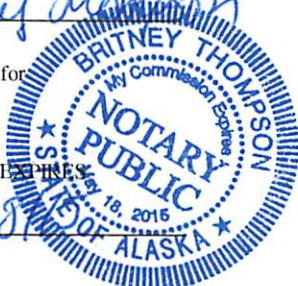

NOTICE OF PROPOSED CHANGES IN THE REGULATIONS OF THE DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION & EARLY DEVELOPMENT

BRIEF DESCRIPTION

The Department of Education & Early Development proposes new regulations by which the Alaska State Museum will designate other Alaska museums or cultural centers as repositories of natural and cultural history materials.

The Department of Education & Early Development proposes to adopt regulation changes in Title 4 of the Alaska Administrative Code to amend 4 AAC 58. The proposed regulations implement AS 14.57.012, which was enacted by the 2014 legislature and authorizes the Alaska State Museum to designate other institutions as repositories of natural and cultural history. The regulations may address the following:

o Designation of natural and cultural history repositories, including application process, alternative accreditation requirements, assurances by institutions, state review, and grounds for revocation of the designation.

You may comment on the proposed regulation changes, including the potential costs to private persons of complying with the proposed changes, by submitting written comments to the Commissioner's Office, Department of Education & Early Development, Attn: Regulations Review, 801 West Tenth Street, Suite 200, PO Box 110500, Juneau, Alaska 99811-0500.
