

NOTICE OF PROPOSED CHANGES ON
CERTIFICATION OF FIDUCIARY REVIEW
IN THE REGULATIONS OF THE DEPARTMENT OF LAW]

BRIEF DESCRIPTION

The Department of Law proposes to adopt regulations on attorney general certification of fiduciary review requested by the fiduciary of a covered fund.

Summary of proposed changes: The Department of Law proposes to adopt regulation changes in Title 9 of the Alaska Administrative Code, dealing with certification of fiduciary review, including the following:

- (1) 9 AAC 70.010 is proposed to be added setting for the purpose of 9 AAC 70.
- (2) 9 AAC 70.015 is proposed to be added relating to documentation required to be submitted by the fiduciary of a covered fund for review by the attorney general.
- (3) 9 AAC 70.020 is proposed to be added relating to action by the attorney general on receipt of a request for fiduciary review from the fiduciary of a covered fund.
- (4) 9 AAC 70.025 is proposed to be added providing definitions for 9 AAC 70.

Written comments: You may comment on the proposed regulation changes, including the potential costs to private persons of complying with the proposed changes, by submitting written comments to 1031 West 4th Avenue, Suite 200, Anchorage, AK 99501. Written comment deadline: The written comments must be received not later than 5:00 p.m. on September 28, 2026.

Public nature of comments and questions: Public comments and questions, once submitted, are public records and subject to disclosure under the Alaska Public Records Act. See AS 40.25.100 - 40.25.295. Do NOT include in your comments or questions any information that you do not want made public.

Obtaining copies of proposed regulations: A copy of the proposed regulation changes is available on the Alaska Online Public Notice System and by contacting Richard Carter at law.regulations.comments@alaska.gov.

Final version of regulations: After the public comment period ends, the Department of Law will either adopt the proposed regulation changes or other provisions dealing with the same subject, without further notice, or decide to take no action. The language of the final regulation may be different from that of the proposed regulation. You should comment during the time allowed if your interests could be affected.

Statutory authority: AS 44.23.020

Statutes being implemented, interpreted, or made specific: AS 44.23.020

Fiscal information: The proposed regulation changes are not expected to require an increased appropriation.
