Approve the proposed non-low-quota fees

Section 8 of the regulation proscribed for a class of IFQ permit holders to receive a lower fee amount:

notwithstanding (2) of this subsection, an applicant for an interim-use permit in a halibut or sablefish fishery regulated under a federal individual fishing quota program may pay an annual base fee corresponding to fee class 1 as specified under (4) of this subsection if the applicant submits an invoice of fishing activity prepared by the National Marine Fisheries Service, Restricted Access Management or, if an invoice is unavailable, other evidence for the most recent completed calendar year showing the applicant fished 8,000 standardized (headed and gutted) pounds or less of halibut or 9,000 round pounds or less of sablefish; for purposes of this paragraph, an applicant's fee under (c) or (d) of this section is 50 percent of the annual base fee the applicant would qualify for under (2) of this subsection.

Since the enactment of 20 AAC 05.245(a)(8), the estimated exvessel prices for sablefish have kept the reduced calculated fee within fee class 1. Tables 1 shows that the calculated fee of \$75 for low quota permit holders is appropriate considering their economic return, and table 2 displays calculations for permit fees with earnings from low quota permit holders removed from the calculation. The regulatory method of calculating fees by including low quota permit holders is displayed in table 3. If the fees are not modified, CFEC would effectively be subsidizing permit costs for non-low quota permit holders.

Please note that the fees for C06B and C61B permit types, as well as B09B and B91B are also adjusted based on vessel capacity. These adjustments are made separately from the low quota calculations and will be addressed in detail when the Commission reviews and discusses changes to the capacity fee structure.

To adopt the fees described in table 2 for non-low quota permit holders, a vote is required. The fee for low quota permit holders is already set by regulation.

Approve the proposed capacity-based alignments

COMMISSION ACTION

Vote: approve the permit fee adjustments in Table 1.

Why this is before the Commission

The proposal aligns fees where larger-capacity or broader-area permits carry greater fishing potential, including the C5AE, D09/D91, K09/K91, M09/M91, and T09/T91 groupings.

column. Permit types that either were modified or used for a modification are highlighted in gray. Other permits and fees are presented in order to provide a full picture of comparable permit types and costs.

The fees for B09B, B91B, C06B, and C61B reflect adjustments for low-quota subsidies applied to sablefish and halibut. After those subsidies are incorporated, the fees are further adjusted to account for permit capacity. This ensures that both quota-related considerations and capacity-related differences are reflected in the final fee structure.

The limited Prince William Sound sablefish large vessel permit (C5AE) lacks sufficient sales volume to allow for a fee determination based on permit value. However, permit sales for each of the other limited Prince William Sound Sablefish permits are comparable and could be used to determine the C5AE fee. Following the procedure of previous years, we recommend that the fee for the C5AE permit be set equal to the fee for C5BE permit, which is the next largest vessel size. A C5AE permit would likely sell for at least as much as a C5BE permit.

For each of the proposed fees in table 1 to be adopted, a vote is required by the Commission.

Set H7BK, H7CK, and H7DK at \$75

COMMISSION ACTION

Vote: approve \$75 annual fees for the three Kodiak trawl permit types.

Why this is before the Commission

No harvests have occurred under the permit types and the standard fee inputs are unavailable; the proposed fee follows CFEC’s usual interim treatment for new or unused permit types.

Fee Calculations and Action Required

No action is needed by the commission to set fees for the H1DK permit type; action is needed to set fees for the H7BK, H7CK and H7DK permit types. No harvests have ever occurred using these permits, and not enough sales have occurred to be able to calculate a market value to use in the setting of fees. The lack of earnings data and permit value data means that a setting of any fee requires a departure from regulation.

Prior to 2002, harvests occurred using the H07K permit type. The H07K permit type was available to vessels of all sizes for the use of trawl gear. When harvests for the H07K permit type are apportioned by vessel size in accordance with table 2 above, fees can be calculated using the traditional method of using 4/10ths of a percentage point of the average gross earnings of a given permit type.

Secondly, vessel length restrictions must also be considered. In all other fisheries when permit fees are higher for a lower capacity permit, fees are adjusted so that they are equal. The average earnings for the H7BK fishery is lower than the H7CK fishery, resulting in a higher fee for a lower capacity fishery. This should be adjusted.

Finally, it should be noted that when permits are either new or unused CFEC has typically set fees equal to \$75 until enough information is available to determine a fee, which is equal to the suggested fees below.

It is our recommendation that the fees be set to \$75 for the H7BK, H7CK, and H7DK permits.

Set C61C and C91C at \$1,575 each

COMMISSION ACTION

Vote: continue the equal-fee policy for the Southern Southeast EQS fishery.

Why this is before the Commission

C61C longline and C91C pot permits receive equal shares of the harvest objective; staff recommends using the C61C market-based fee for both permit types.

Historically, each of these permit types has similar average gross earnings, as would be expected under the equal-quota-share management structure.

Because there have been so few sales of C91C permits, it is not possible to calculate a market price for the pot gear permit type. Only one C91C permit sale has occurred since limitation (in 1997), compared with 24 sales of C61C permits. Normally, when no permit prices are available, CFEC relies on average earnings data to determine the fee. Because only three C91C permits exist, reporting their average gross earnings would be confidential; however, the fee works out to \$300 (Table 1).

It would not be logical to base the fee on average gross earnings in the fishery when all permits are equal-quota-share permits.

It is our recommendation based upon the above facts that the fee for the pot permits be set equal to the fee for the longline permits due to their equal quota shares. If no action is taken to adjust the fees, then fees for pot permits would be substantially less than the longline permit fees.

This correction has occurred since 2014, when the Commissioners determined that both permit types in the same fishery should have similar fees to reflect the intent of 20 AAC 05.245. For the 2026 permit year, the fee was further adjusted downward due to record-low sablefish prices in 2024 (\$1.65/lbs). Prices have since recovered to just over \$2.20 per pound, and we do not believe a further downward adjustment is necessary.

The vote before the Commissioners is whether CFEC should continue the annual policy of setting equal fees for both permit types in this EQS fishery, based on the market price of the C61C permit type. The fee would \$1,575 for both permit types.

Set S04I, LA28B, and LA13B at \$75

COMMISSION ACTION

Vote: approve \$75 annual fees for S04I, LA28B, and LA13B.

Why this is before the Commission

S04I is a new Cook Inlet administrative area without permit-specific history; LA28B and LA13B have not been used and lack permit-specific earnings data.

Arctic Lamprey Permit Types

On June 25, 2024, the Commission voted to establish several new regulatory codes, including a new fishery resource code and three new gear codes. These changes resulted in four new permit types: LA28B, LA13B, M9EB, and M9EG.

Under 20 AAC 05.245, open entry permit fees are generally based on 0.4 percent of the average gross earnings from the most recent three years of available data for a permit type. At the time the new permit types were established, permit-specific gross earnings information did not exist. Historically, when a new permit type lacked the information necessary to calculate a fee, the Commission established an initial fee of \$75. The Commission therefore established \$75 fees for the four new permit types.

The circumstances surrounding the M9EB and M9EG small-vessel miscellaneous finfish pot permits have subsequently changed. Permits have been purchased and used, and CFEC now has permit-specific information from which future fees can be determined. Accordingly, M9EB and M9EG do not require further special treatment and are not addressed by this recommendation.

The Arctic lamprey fishery on the Yukon River has been managed by the Alaska Department of Fish and Game since 2003. Historically, it has been a small fishery with low participation and relatively low gross earnings. In 2025 this fishery generated just under \$20,000 in gross earnings, or about \$6,600 per permit.

When LA28B and LA13B were created, Research anticipated that subsequent participation and earnings would eventually provide the data necessary to establish fees under the normal methodology. That has not occurred.

Although more than two years have passed since the Commission established the new permit codes, no one has purchased and used these permits to participate in the Arctic lamprey fishery. Consequently, CFEC has accumulated no LA28B- or LA13B-specific gross earnings data with which to calculate a fee under 20 AAC 05.245.

Furthermore, ADF&G has petitioned that these permit types be eliminated and that Arctic lamprey fishing instead be incorporated into the appropriate freshwater permit types.

Research recommends that the annual fees for LA28B and LA13B remain at \$75.

The \$75 fee is consistent with the fee initially established when these permit types were created, is appropriate given the historically low earnings associated with the Arctic lamprey fishery and avoids creating an alternative fee methodology for permit types that have never been used.

Approve contingent fee reductions if closure occurs

Vote: approve a \$300 reduction for K29A, K49A, and K69A if ADF&G closes the 2026-27 red/blue king crab fishery.

Why this is before the Commission

K19A fees are waived by regulation if the fishery is closed. The contingent adjustment would forgo approximately \$14,910 in revenue.

about whether an opening would occur. Since 2011, the fishery has opened intermittently but has been closed more often than it has been open.

When authorized by the Alaska Department of Fish and Game (ADF&G), the red and blue king crab fishery opens by regulation in November. ADF&G has not yet announced whether the fishery will open for the 2026–2027 season. That determination is typically made in September, after crab enumeration and stock-assessment activities are completed. The fishery was open during the 2025–2026 season.

When a fishery is closed, CFEC waives the applicable renewal fees by regulation. If the red and blue king crab fishery is closed for the 2026–2027 winter season, renewal fees for all K19A permit holders will be waived. Permit holders who have already paid the renewal fee will receive refunds.

The question before the commissioners is whether fees should also be adjusted for combination permits that authorize participation in the red and blue king crab fishery together with the brown king crab or Tanner crab fisheries.

In previous years when the red and blue king crab fishery was closed, the commissioners reduced the renewal fees for the K29A (red, blue, and brown king crab), K49A (red and blue king crab and Tanner crab), and K69A (red, blue, and brown king crab and Tanner crab) permit types. The reduction was equal to the renewal fee for a red and blue king crab permit. For 2027, that amount would be \$300. Table 2 shows the effect of applying the proposed reduction. Poverty fees are established by regulation at one-half of the regular fee.

Because ADF&G has not yet announced whether it will open the 2026–2027 red and blue king crab fishery, staff cannot currently recommend reducing the associated combination-permit fees by \$300. A similar situation occurred last year, when ADF&G had not announced its decision by the date of the Commission’s fee meeting.

Staff recommends that the commissioners take an approach consistent with last year’s action: approve a \$300 reduction in the renewal fees for the applicable combination permits, contingent upon ADF&G announcing that the 2026–2027 red and blue king crab fishery will be closed.

At its recent Southeast Alaska meeting, the Alaska Board of Fisheries lowered the population threshold required to open the fishery. This change significantly increases the likelihood of future openings. The 2025–2026 fishery occurred under the amended regulations.

If the fishery is closed and the combination-permit fee adjustment is implemented, CFEC would forgo approximately \$14,910 in renewal-fee revenue.

Approve market adjustments and fee waiver

COMMISSION ACTION

Vote: approve market adjustments for G02Z and G34E permits.
Waive Norton Sound Herring permit fees for 2026.

Why this is before the Commission

Markets and harvest opportunities are limited, and existing fee calculations do not reflect current economic conditions in the Norton Sound and Prince William Sound herring fisheries.

entry permit, they have never been brought and sold on the open market, and it is impossible to calculate a permit value. As a result, the fee is determined by the most recent three years of harvests (1996 – 2000), which have average gross earnings of \$38,000. This means the fee assessed to \$150.

A permit renewal fee of \$150 is not appropriate considering that the average gross earnings data in this fishery is close to three decades old. We recommend setting the fee at \$75, the lowest fee class.

Norton Sound Herring Fishery 2026 Fee Waiver

Only one buyer exists in the Norton Sound herring fishery, and this buyer will only purchase herring from specific individuals. The market for most G02Z and G34Z permit holders is closed. At the April 2025 CFEC administrative meeting CFEC commissioners voted to waive fees for permit holders who did not participate in the fishery for 2024 and 2025.

We recommend that the commission continue to waive fees for the 2026 season. Participation and earnings information are confidential, but both were minimal in 2026. There are a total of 257 G34Z permits, and eight G02Z permits. Waiving these fees would result in approximately \$19,875 in lost
