FINDING OF EMERGENCY

The Alaska Board of Fisheries finds that an emergency exists and that the attached regulations are necessary for the immediate preservation of public peace, health, safety, or general welfare. The facts constituting the emergency include the following:

1. Through October 3, 1999, in Kodiak Area, there were 8.5 million pounds of Pacific cod taken by all gear groups from an 11.7 million pound guideline harvest level. Jig gear harvested 2.3 million pounds; pot gear vessels longer than 58 feet harvested 2.3 million pounds and vessels smaller than 58 feet using pot gear harvested 3.9 million pounds.
2. The remaining 3.2 million pounds of the guideline harvest level are now available to both pot and jig gear under the clean up provisions of the management plan. Fishing by pot gear vessels longer than 58 feet in length will close when their vessel category harvests another 600,000 pounds according to the provisions of 5 AAC 28.467(c)(4).
3. It is unlikely that the guideline harvest level will be reached by December 31, 1999, without continued participation by the larger pot gear vessels beyond the current regulatory caps.

ADOPTION ORDER
